As we step into Spring 2025, we proudly celebrate a major milestone. Wiltshire and Bath Air Ambulance Charity's 35th anniversary.


Throughout this issue, you will find a range of exciting events to mark the occasion.



A look back in time

Wiltshire and Bath Air Ambulance Charity has evolved significantly since its inception in 1990.

The concept originated in 1988 when a temporary helicopter, hired by Wiltshire Police for the summer solstice at Stonehenge, was diverted to airlift a critically injured woman from a road accident on the A350 at Beanacre (pictured). This successful mission demonstrated the potential of a joint emergency helicopter service.

An initial three-month trial with Wiltshire Police and Wiltshire Ambulance Service sharing an aircraft soon turned into the official launch of a full-time joint helicopter service on 15 March 1990, based at the police headquarters in Devizes.

To support the service, the Wiltshire Air Ambulance Appeal was established in 1991 by Dr Dick Riseley-Prichard, focusing on fundraising efforts.

By 1995, the police covered two-thirds of the operational costs, with the charity contributing £134,000 annually through various fundraising activities.

Advancements continued with the introduction of an MD 902 Explorer helicopter in December 1998, offering enhanced capabilities.

In 2001, the service became the first UK air ambulance to operate night flights, extending its operational hours to 19 per day.

A significant transition occurred on 1 January 2015, when the partnership with Wiltshire Police concluded, and the Charity began operating as a standalone air ambulance service.

This independence was further solidified in May 2018 with the move to a purposebuilt airbase in Semington, bringing the aircrew and charity team under one roof. The rebrand to Wiltshire and Bath Air Ambulance Charity took place in November 2024, with the adoption of a new name and logo to better represent its commitment to the communities it serves.

New name, same expert critical care

We entered our 35th year as Wiltshire and Bath Air Ambulance Charity, having recently renamed from Wiltshire Air Ambulance.

Chief executive David Philpott explains: "For three years now, Bath has been our second most visited area after Swindon. We felt it was only right to have the charity's name reflect our true operational area.

"It's important to stress, nothing will change clinically, we will continue to be there for the people of Wiltshire and Bath – just as we have done for the last 35 years. Simply put, we now have a name that truly tells our story." For the first time in 2024, the Charity attended over 100 missions in Bath in a single calendar year. This represents around nine per cent of all yearly missions and once again demonstrates the importance of our work to the city.

You can see our new-look helicopter and critical care cars to the right, which include our changed colours and brand new logo.

The helicopter can fly to Bath's city centre and surrounding villages in just four minutes. During 2024, the team attended 117 missions in Bath and transported 108 patients to the Royal United Hospital in the city. DID YOU KNOW? FAQs

When are you active?

We are on call every day for up to 19 hours. On average our critical care team respond to three potentially lifesaving missions in that time.

How long does it take to fly to Bath?

From our airbase in Semington, it takes us just four minutes to reach the centre of Bath. We can reach anywhere in Wiltshire within just 11 minutes.

Teaching lifesaving skills to children

In 2024, we delivered emergency awareness training to 11,529 young people, marking a 5.2% increase compared to 2023.

These sessions took place across 89 schools, a 20% growth from the previous year. Since the scheme launched in 2019, a total of 45,084 pupils have now learnt vital emergency response skills.



Andrew Robinson, the Charity's emergency awareness instructor, said, "Our aim is to educate the community and provide them with the knowledge to confidently manage a medical emergency prior to the arrival of an ambulance or air ambulance critical care crew.

"Sessions are tailored to engage all ages and adapted to cater for pupils with special educational needs. We also deliver sessions to home educational groups and community clubs."

How do I live without you?



Christian and Kate Okun experienced every parent's worst nightmare when their bubbly 15-week-old child, Franklin, stopped breathing suddenly in

Their first-born had been with grandparents when his mattress alarm went off indicating he wasn't breathing.

May 2020.

Frantic calls to the emergency services saw Wiltshire and Bath Air Ambulance Charity dispatched, and critical care paramedics Dan Tucker and Sophie Holt performed a series of medical interventions to regain the baby's heartbeat.

Working alongside neighbouring Great Western Air Ambulance, the medics sedated Franklin, in an attempt to help his brain recover from the trauma.

Franklin was transferred to Bristol Royal Hospital for Children, where he underwent a series of tests over the next two days.

Dad Christian explained: "We knew Franklin was extremely poorly and were preparing ourselves for the worst, albeit at the same time holding out hope."

Just 48 hours later, on 2 June 2020, the Okun's were given the news no parent ever wants to hear, as tests showed baby Franklin was only being kept alive by the machines and there was nothing more doctors could do.

Christian says: "We knew we had to turn the machine off.

"We played *How do I live without you?* by Leann Rimes and Kate held him in her arms. From the moment they turned the machine off, the colour just drained from him. It was almost instant and was heartbreaking to see."

Franklin had died of sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS), sometimes known as cot death, something which affects around 200 infants every year in the UK.

Christian added: "If it wasn't for Wiltshire and Bath Air Ambulance Charity getting to Franklin and getting the heartbeat back, we wouldn't have had those extra couple of days with him; priceless moments.

"We wouldn't have been able to say goodbye. No matter how much money we raise, we can't ever thank the charity enough for that.

"Franklin was the happiest child, he was always smiling and laughing," says Christian, whilst proudly showing a video of him bouncing on his lap.

Kate describes Franklin as "the cheekiest little heartbreaker" and her "dream come true".

Christian has since channelled his grief into supporting the charities that helped them. He cycled the North Coast 500 in 2024 and completed a sponsored ride from Calne to Bristol, raising over £11,000.

"You are funded by us, and we all have to do our bit," he said.

Secure a solicitor-drafted will: We've partnered with Parker Bullen LLP, a long-established law firm based in Salisbury, to help you through the entire will-writing process.

Write a will online: Through Make A Will Online, you can create a solicitor-checked will at your own pace from the comfort of your home.

You don't need to include a gift to us to use our free will services, but if you are able to leave a gift after caring for your loved ones, we'd be incredibly grateful.
